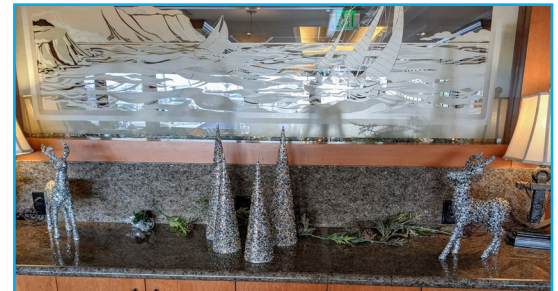

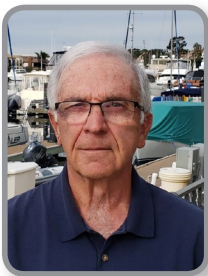
I would personally like to thank BCYC's staff and members for making 2021 a memorable year. I look forward to 2022!

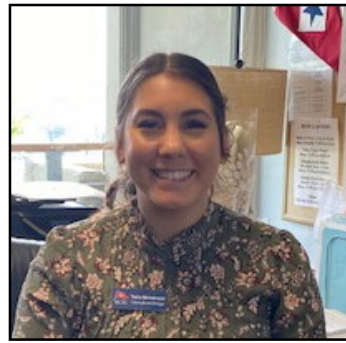

The following seven pages contain changes to the BCYC bylaws, house rules and employee rules. These changes were approved by the Board of Directors at the Oct. 28, 2021, board meeting. The verbiage in red replaces previous wording or is an addition to these documents. Members are requested to familiarize themselves with the bylaw and rule changes.

2.2 FLAG MEMBERSHIP.

...

(g) Title.

...

(ii) Significant Others.

(A) Any unmarried Flag Member may designate another adult person with whom such Member permanently dwells as such Member's Significant Other and register the designation with the Club. A registered Significant Other designated in accordance with this Section 2.2(g)(ii)(A) shall have full use of the Club facilities while so registered. The sponsoring Member, by registering the Significant Other, agrees to assume all legal responsibility for the acts of and charges incurred by the Significant Other. The sponsoring Member can withdraw the registration at any time by giving written notice to the Club via U.S. mail or electronic mail addressed to the General Manager. The Board of Directors shall from time to time establish administrative policies and rules necessary to implement this provision of the Bylaws. Nothing in this provision precludes a Significant Other from applying for or becoming a Member.

...

4.4 MEMBER ACCOUNTS.

...

(b) If a Member account is deemed to be delinquent under the accounting policy then in effect, the delinquent Member is to be placed on the "Denied Credit List". The Member will remain on denied credit status until the delinquent account is paid in full. The Treasurer shall cause to be sent to the Member by mail at the current address shown ~~on~~ in the Club's records or by electronic mail-email to the member's registered email address ~~current email address shown in the Club records,~~ a notice that the Member has been denied credit. The Executive Committee may deny credit to any Member when it is deemed to be in the best financial interest of the Club.

(c) If the account remains unpaid after an additional thirty (30) days, the Treasurer shall cause to be sent to the delinquent Member by ~~first class mail, postage paid and by Certified Mail,~~ at the current address shown on the Club's records or by electronic mail to the member's registered email address, a notice advising the Member that unless the account is brought current within fifteen (15) days, that all rights and privileges of the Member in the Club shall be involuntarily suspended.

...

5.1 ANNUAL MEETING. The Annual Meeting of the Members shall be held in the City of Newport Beach, California, on the most convenient day nearest the first Saturday in December of each year at such time and place as the Board of Directors shall determine. Notice of the Annual Meeting shall be ~~sent-mailed~~ sent by the Secretary to ~~each~~ each Members of the Club by U.S. mail or by electronic mail to the member's registered email address at least ten (10) days prior to said meeting.

5.2 SPECIAL MEETINGS. Special Meetings of the Members may be called by the Commodore, and shall be called by the Commodore upon the written request of five (5) Directors or ten percent (10%) of the voting Members of the Club within fifteen (15) days of receipt of such request. Special Meetings may be held at such time and place as the Commodore deems suitable within the City of Newport Beach, California. Notice of not less than ten (10) days, giving the time and place at which a Special Meeting is to be held and stating the nature of the business to be transacted shall be ~~sent-mailed~~ sent by the Secretary to ~~each~~ each Members of the Club by U.S. mail or by electronic mail to the member's registered email address. The only business transacted at any Special Meeting of the Members shall be that stated on the notice thereof.

5.8 RECORD DATE. For purposes of establishing the Members entitled to receive notice of any meeting, entitled to vote at any meeting, entitled to vote by written ballot, or entitled to exercise any rights in any lawful action, the Board of Directors may, in advance, fix a record date.

(a) The date for:

(i) sending notice of a meeting shall be no more than ninety (90) nor less than (A) ten (10) days before the date of the meeting if sent via first-class U.S. mail or electronic mail, or (B) less than twenty (20) days before the date of the meeting if sent by other than first-class U.S. mail or electronic mail;

8.2 EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

(a) The Executive Committee shall consist of the Commodore, Vice Commodore, Rear Commodore and Secretary. ~~Officers of the Club, identified in Section 7.1, except for the Treasurer.~~

(f) Any charitable events to be held at the Club, or to be advertised or sponsored in conjunction with the Club name, or any solicitation for charitable contributions from members utilizing Club mailing lists, social media accounts, or other resources, require the prior approval of the Executive Committee.

8.8 NOMINATING COMMITTEE.

(c) The Secretary shall cause the list of all such nominations to be posted on the bulletin board in the Clubhouse and sent to each Member by U.S. mail or by electronic mail to ~~the each~~ Member's registered email address on or before the second Saturday of October.

8.9 ELECTIONS COMMITTEE.

...

(d) With at least a majority of the Elections Committee Members present, the Committee shall, by the next succeeding Tuesday, count the ballots, canvass the election and certify the results thereof to the Commodore. If the number of candidates for Director is equal to the number of vacancies for election as Directors, votes constituting at least a majority of the ballots cast shall be necessary to elect a Director. If the number of candidates for Director is greater than the number of vacancies for election as Directors, a plurality of votes cast shall be sufficient to elect a Director. If two or more candidates for one office shall receive an equal number of votes the retiring Commodore shall call a Special Meeting of the retiring Board of Directors (per Section 6.10) and a majority of those members present and voting shall be sufficient to "break the tie" and elect a candidate. This Special Meeting shall be held as soon as possible and prior to the Annual Meeting (Section 6.8) held for the purpose of election of officers and appointment of Committee Chairpersons. The Elections Committee Chairperson shall as soon as possible give notice ~~by mail~~ of the results of the election to the Members of the Club by U.S. mail or by electronic mail to the Member's registered email address.

(b) Statement of Charges. The Board of Directors shall cause a statement of such charges, along with a copy of this Article IX, together with notice of not less than fifteen (15) days of the time and place where the Board of Directors shall meet for the consideration thereof, to be sent mailed by first class mail to the Flag Member charged by U.S. mail to such person's address as it appears on the records of the club or by electronic mail

~~to the Member's registered email address at such person's address as it appears on the records of the Club.~~ The Statement of Charges shall include the reasons for the commencement of disciplinary proceeds including approximate dates, places and locations where appropriate.

14.1 NOTICE OF BYLAW AMENDMENTS. Notice of the general nature of any amendment to these Bylaws adopted by the Board of Directors shall be given in writing ~~to each Member~~ by U.S. mail ~~or by electronic mail to the Member's registered email address~~ to the Members at least twenty (20) days before the amendment takes effect. Such notice will be given in accordance with the procedure for notice of changes in club rules or policies set forth in Sections 14.2 (b) and (c) hereof.

14.2 NOTICE OF RULE OR POLICY CHANGES. The Board of Directors shall cause notice of any changes in Club rules or policies to be provided to ~~each~~the Members as follows:

(a) Written notice shall be provided by the club ~~by~~via U.S. mMail, ~~by electronic mail to the member's registered email address,~~ or ~~by publication in~~ The Masthead.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

HOUSE RULES

The Club does not warrant the sufficiency, condition or state of repair of its facilities or equipment. Members, families, guests, agents, service persons and others using Club facilities and equipment do so at their own risk.

The Board of Directors adopts rules and regulations it deems advisable to insure the greatest possible pleasure, comfort and convenience for members, their families and friends. Members are requested to familiarize themselves with these rules and to cooperate in their observations. Suggestions for changes and additions may be made in writing to the Executive Committee.

Enforcement decisions regarding Members' and Guests' violations of these House Rules will be the responsibility of the General Manager or his/her designee or the Executive Committee. Members will generally receive at least one warning of violation except in the case of (i) prior documented conduct violation(s); (ii) an emergency; or (iii) for conduct deemed to interfere with any person. The General Manager will log and report Member and Guest violations to the Executive Committee. Final warnings will be recorded. Penalties shall be determined by the Executive Committee. In habitual or egregious cases Club privileges may be suspended or forfeited in accordance with Article IX of the Club's Bylaws.

B. GUESTS

...

5. **Guests of Members** – Members shall have the right to extend to their friends, guest privileges in accordance with Club rules.

a. *Member Responsibility for Guests* – Members are responsible for the conduct and financial obligations of their guests whether accompanied or unaccompanied by the Member.

c. *Unaccompanied Guests* – A member must make prior arrangements for the issuance of a Guest Card and parking permit for an unaccompanied guest. This will enable the office to have the card ready for the guest upon arrival and ensure the identity of the guest. Unaccompanied guests will be on a cash basis, unless prior arrangements have been made for charges to be made to the sponsoring member's account.

F. PARKING LOT AND GROUNDS RULES

1. **Authorized Vehicles; Display of Permits** – Only vehicles displaying valid permits in such manner specified by the Club are authorized to be parked in the parking

lot. Permits must be plainly and fully visible from the outside of vehicles. Unauthorized vehicles are prohibited in the parking lot and are subject to action set forth herein.

~~**Authorized use** – The parking lot is private property and may be used only by Club members in good standing ("Members"), authorized invited guests (as hereinafter defined), employees and vendors providing goods or services as requested by the Club or the Club's marina tenants ("Vendors"), in accordance with this policy. A sign will be placed at the entrance advising that the parking lot is private property and that unauthorized vehicles will be towed and further stating that permission to enter is revocable at any time. It is the Club's intent that the parking lot is for use by Members, Guests, employees and Vendors.~~

2. **Permits** – The Club will issue parking permits as follows:

a. ~~*Members*~~ – ~~To all Members of driving age who request them, at no cost, for any automobile registered to the Member or his/her immediate family.~~ Members must apply at the office for each permit sticker and provide information and documentation for each vehicle as requested by the Club; any change in vehicle information must be reported to the front office as soon as possible. When a vehicle~~car~~ is sold, the permit sticker must be removed.

...

~~d. — *Vendors* – To Vendors upon such restrictions as the General Manager or the Executive Committee may impose in their sole discretion. Vendors must obtain a parking permit from the front office. Vendor hours for marina contractors are from 8am to 5pm except for emergency repair.~~

d. *Terms and Conditions.*

(i) *Types of Permits* – Different types of parking permits may be issued in respect of (a) different types of vehicles (for example, a permit sticker, a card for display on the dashboard or hangers for rear view mirrors for cars and trucks, a sticker for motorcycles and other vehicles and trailers), (b) Members, and (c) Guests ~~and (d) Vendors~~. Permits may be numbered and accounted for by the Club;

(ii) *Expiration* – Guest ~~and Vendor~~ parking permits expire as shown thereon; Member permits expire when the holder is no longer a Member of the Club in good standing, in which case the former Member or Member not in good standing automatically relinquishes all parking privileges and must return the issued parking permit (permit sticker) to the Club. The permit also will expire when cancelled for cause, as set forth elsewhere herein.

~~(iii) — *No Club Responsibility for Loss, Damage or Injury* — The Club assumes no responsibility or liability for loss damage or injury to any person, vehicle, trailer or its load (and all accessories and contents of such vehicles, trailers and loads) in on or around the parking lot resulting from vehicular or other negligence, fire, theft, collision, vandalism, water, explosion, flood, collapse, structural failure, subsidence, intentional acts, law enforcement, riots, insurrection, terrorism, acts of war, acts of God or other causes, it being the policy of the Club that use of the parking lot is at permit holder's risk, and by accepting a parking permit for the parking lot, the holder agrees to accept all such risks and that Club shall have no such responsibility or liability.~~

(iii) *Limitations on Use of Parking Permits* – Parking permits may NOT be duplicated, sold, subleased, given, lent, or otherwise transferred to friends, guests, employees or any other person, and any attempt to do so shall be void and subject to action as set forth herein.

(iv) *Member's Parking Without Permits* – In those instances when a Member's permit is forgotten, a temporary Guest permit should be requested from the front office. If the front office is closed, a clearly dated note with the Member's name should be prominently placed on the dash or other area of the vehicle as appropriate to the vehicle to inform the Club's staff or security personnel.

(v) *Cancellation of Suspension of Permits* – Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, the Club's Commodore or its Executive Committee shall have the right to cancel, modify or suspend any permit at any time in the best interests of the Club.

3. **Authorized Use; No Club Responsibility For Loss or Damage – The parking lot is private property and may be used only by Club members in good standing ("Members"), Guests, employees and vendors, in accordance with this policy. A sign will be placed at the entrance advising that the parking lot is private property and that unauthorized vehicles will be towed and further stating that permission to enter is revocable at any time. It is the Club's intent that the parking lot is for use by Members, Guests, employees and vendors. Authorized Vehicles; Display of Permits—Only vehicles displaying valid permits in such manner specified by the Club are authorized to be parked in the parking lot. Permits must be plainly and fully visible from the outside of vehicles. Unauthorized vehicles are prohibited in the parking lot and are subject to action set forth herein. The Club assumes no responsibility or liability for loss damage or injury to any person, property or thing involving any vehicle, trailer or its load (and all accessories and contents of such vehicles, trailers and loads) in on or around the parking lot, it being the policy of the Club that use of the parking lot is at the user's risk and that Club shall have no such responsibility or liability.**

9. **Violations, enforcement and penalties** – The Clubhouse, Club restrooms, Club grounds and Club parking lot will be monitored as needed.

a. *Enforcement* – Enforcement decisions regarding Members' and Guests' violations of these Parking Lot and Grounds Rules will be the responsibility of the General Manager or his/her designee or the Executive Committee. Members will generally receive at least one warning of violation except in the case of prior documented conduct violation(s); an emergency; or for conduct deemed to interfere with any person. The General Manager will log in, and report Member and Guest violations to the Executive Committee Club's Commodore. Final warnings will be recorded. Penalties shall be determined by the Executive Committee. In habitual or egregious cases, parking privileges or where applicable, Club privileges may be suspended or forfeited in accordance with Article IX of the Club's Bylaws.

EMPLOYEE RULES

3. *Respectful Treatment* – No Member or guest of a member shall criticize, demean or in any way harass employees of the Club. If a problem does arise, a Member or employee shall immediately or as soon as possible direct that problem to the General Manager, the employee's immediate supervisor, a Flag Officer, a Director, the Judge Advocate, or the Treasurer Vice Commodore, or Rear Commodore.
