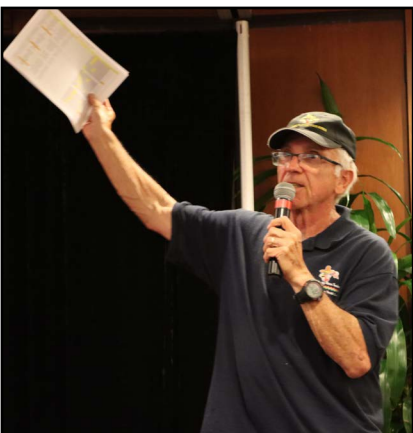
## *The Final Taco Tuesday*

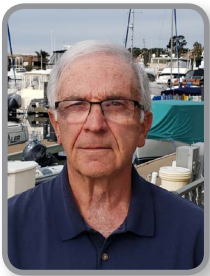

### Racing for the Bowl

Ask any racer why they race and the answer is almost always “for the fun,” but deep down, they’re thinking: “that bowl sure would look good in the trophy cabinet at my yacht club, with my name on it.”

Speaking of bowls, the Prince of Wales Bowl (pictured) originated in 1931 as a gift from his Royal Highness, Prince Edward Albert, to the Royal Nova Scotia Yacht Squadron (RNSYS) for the purpose of promoting small-boat sailing among junior yachtsmen.



In 1965, the Bowl was transferred to the Southern Massachusetts Yacht Racing Association (SMYRA) with the clear intent of fostering match racing among its members and, if successful, on a national basis. SMYRA was successful and the first United States Match Racing Championship was held in 1967.

The 2021 United States Match Racing Championship will take place Oct. 1-3 in Long Beach. I suggest you take a fun day off from whatever you normally do and go view the race (off Belmont Pier). It is very different from the “drag-race” type of sailboat racing that we’re accustomed to. Watch the two boats just before the start...it’s a “strategic” battle as each competitor tries to gain an advantage over the other. They will both try to cause the other boat to infringe a rule and receive a penalty, or simply get the most advantageous position on the starting line for themselves so that they are in control of the race.

Not into match racing and prefer the traditional type of race? Well, make sure you participate in the following races:

**BCYC BOGART SERIES** – the annual two-day race over to Avalon on Saturday and back on Sunday. There’s actually a bowl for one of the winners and some other rather nice perpetual trophies. The first race day is Oct. 9, so you still have time to register.

**SSYC HALLOWEEN REGATTA** – an article about racing in October would not be complete without mention of a Halloween Regatta, and South Shore Yacht Club has one scheduled on Oct. 23. This would be a good opportunity to work on your costume for the BCYC Hot Rum race. Remember, racing is for fun!

**BCYC HOT RUM SERIES** – for those of you who prefer to sail in the harbor, the Hot Rum series is for you. Included are three race days over three months, featuring two races each day. On the first race day, Nov. 14, we add a little more fun to the competition by encouraging everyone to dress in their finest pirate regalia. Race Committee will vote and the winner of the best-costumed boat will win a bottle of grog (that’s rum to landlubbers).



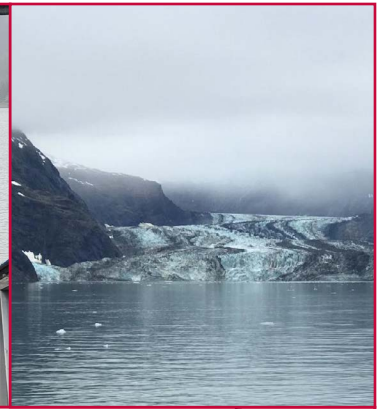
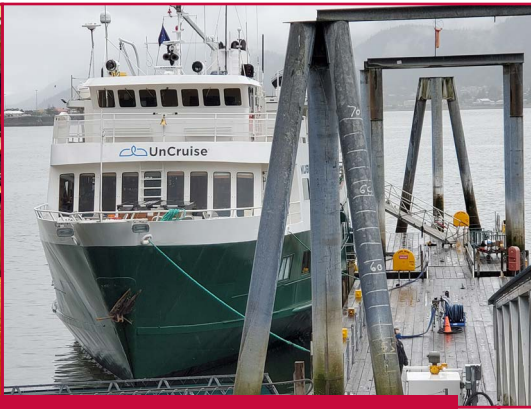

### Families Enjoy BCYC Events

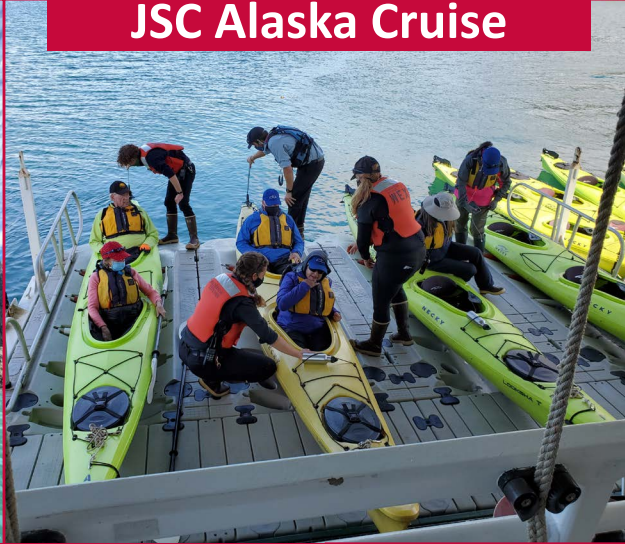
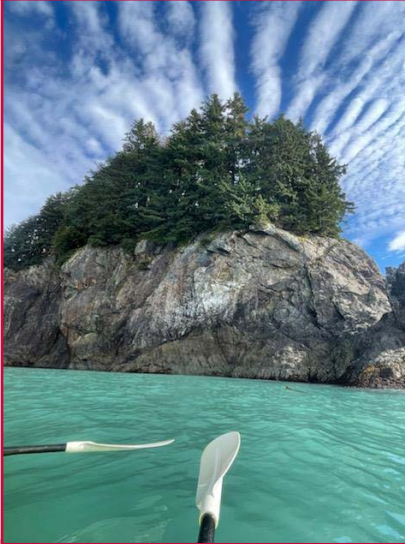

As COVID-19 strikes yet again, not only is BCYC finding it difficult to return to normal, but so are most Southern California and restaurants nationwide. Members report back to us regarding visits to Orange County restaurants and the changes they have encountered. Again, although BCYC is not at 100 percent, friends continue to meet and enjoy Prime Rib Night, Omelet Express, Sunday Night Supper, Lounge Nights and many other activities planned by various committees that support the success of “the friendliest club on the bay.” As the holiday season approaches, we look forward to celebrating many events at BCYC. Come to the club and meet new staff, new members and enjoy fellowship with old friends.

In 2006, the Rancho Mirage Ritz Carlton closed. In 2008, after a brief period as chef at Indian Wells Country Club, BCYC was fortunate in recruiting Chef Georges as our executive chef.

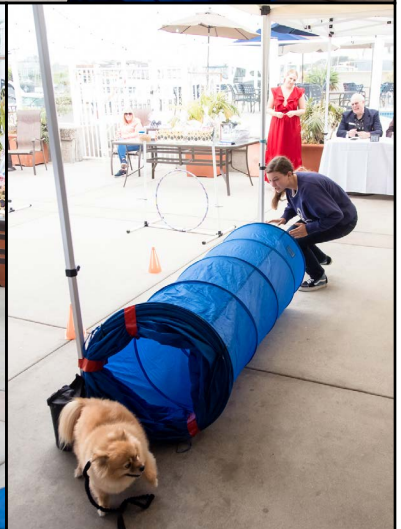
**Agility:** Radar Bryant, Khaleesi Ayloush, Taika Shurilla-Brand

In addition, a member's vehicle remaining in the lot for an extended period of time, other than a member cruise, needs to display a special permit – this permit can be obtained from General Manager Scott Jones or Waterfront Manager Debbie Dunne.

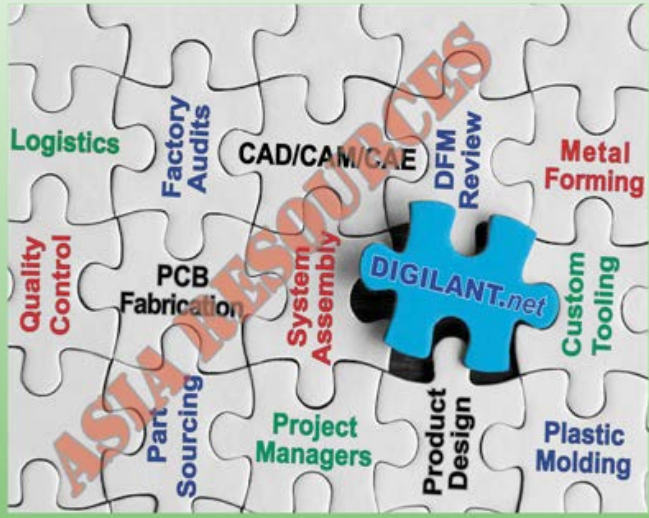
