Corinthian is Launched*

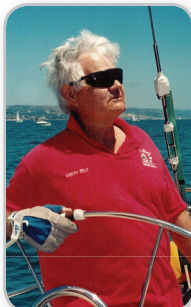

*Predicted Log Invitation(al)*

**I**want to take this opportunity to thank Roger Chaix for donating his time and beautiful boat, *Nauti Holiday*, as our April race committee boat. Roger, your help was indeed appreciated.

BCYC is hosting the Bahia Corinthian Invitational June 4, in conjunction with Southern California Cruiser Association. This predicted log contest requires that each skipper attempt to most accurately predict the time it will take to navigate a specified course in their boat. The course, published in the race instructions issued by the host club several weeks prior to the contest, typically consists of four or more legs totaling about 25 miles. Before the event, skippers turn in a log that specifies the amount of time they expect to take in navigating each leg of the course. Skippers then start on the course at their predicted starting time. An observer aboard the boat collects all watches so skipper and crew have no knowledge of the actual elapsed time during the contest. As the boat completes each leg, the

observer records the actual time on the log. Upon completing the course, the Race Committee computes the percentage error between the predicted and actual time for each boat. The skipper with the lowest margin of error wins.

There is really no secret to it. You don't have to be a mathematical wizard or genius, nor do you need 100,000 miles of experience on your boat. You simply need some speed data you can easily obtain running the course ahead of time, and a basic understanding of the procedure for calculating your log. One more thing you'll need is the desire to join in with a fine group of yachtsmen like yourself as you enjoy using your boat during the contest, and sharing in good fellowship afterwards at the trophy presentation.

I'm working to schedule a seminar to help all of us learn more about calculating your log and participating in this fun event. I invite all BCYC boaters, power and sail, to join me in this exciting contest on the water.

Now Hear This

The California Fish and Game Commission approved the creation of 36 new Marine Protected Areas (MPAs) encompassing 187 square miles of state waters in the Southern California area. These will include no-take state marine reserves and conservation areas where no fishing will be allowed; a very small portion of the MPAs will have different take allowances and levels of protection. These regulations are expected to go into effect mid-year. The Ocean Access Protection Fund (OAPF) has initiated a court challenge. They feel the process in developing these new MPAs was flawed, designed to restrict public access rather than protect



marine species. Visit [dfg.ca.gov](http://dfg.ca.gov) and [oceanaccessprotectionfund.org](http://oceanaccessprotectionfund.org) to get more information. Get involved and become part of the process to resolve this situation!

The BCYC All-Species Fishing Tournament is June 11.
