As I look back on our successes this year, I am excited and incredibly proud of the **complete domination** by our BCYC Junior Sailors. Aside from the many local Newport and regional events that they have won, I am happy to report that last month Team BCYC won our very own **Corinthian Cup** and brought the Team High-Point Perpetual trophy back home for the first time in six years! Additionally, we currently have the largest CFJ class in the bay with 23 sailors, and our Fall Program as a whole is the strongest it's ever been with 41 enrolled. We are also finding success on the non-racing side of sailing with our first-ever Junior Mariners class this year.

Looking forward, we have four juniors planning to compete in the C420, Laser Radial and Optimist classes at the Orange Bowl in Miami this month. These young sailors hope to represent BCYC across the country as they advance their skills and racing careers, but sail racing is very expensive. Many years ago, the Bahia Sail Racing Association (a 501(c)3 non-profit), now known as The Sailing Foundation, was created to support young sailors who want to learn and compete in such sailing events. We have a great opportunity to help many young sailors such as these in our Junior Program by contributing to the foundation so they can afford to compete at such a high level.

After the last-place boat had passed me a thought raced through my mind. “Did I remember to put my plug in this morning?” I slid to the back of my boat, took a peek and was horrified – I had totally forgotten my stern plug. The boat was slow because the inside of my boat was full of water, which makes the boat heavier.

While not the best memory, it is lessons like these that help racers grow. I know that I will never make that mistake again. Sometimes in life it takes a few lessons learned the hard way to be able to succeed!

Success*

BCYC Junior Sailing had an extraordinary 2015 sailing season and has enjoyed a number of remarkable successes, thanks to our talented junior sailors. Prior to our team victory at the Corinthian Cup, BCYC sailors Jake and Max Mayol respectively took **1st** and 3rd in the Gold Fleet at the August Junior Sabot Nationals in Alamitos Bay. In double-handed sailing, Derek and Sammy Pickell took 2nd at the 2015 CFJ Nationals in Santa Barbara. This fall, Max Mayol and Laurel Foster found success around the region placing inside the top five at Shadden Series regattas. Most recently, six of our nine sailors who entered took home trophies from the local LIYC Halloween Regatta.

Even more notable is the level of participation we are reaching, particularly with our double-handed teams. During the summer, we were borrowing boats and trailers in order to get everyone on the water – a great problem to have, because it shows we have an eager group of sailors who want to be at BCYC. Due to this growth, the club has seen increasing attendance at youth regattas, not only around the region, but around the country. For the first time ever we sent a team to compete in the Perry Series, a regional C420 series of four regattas that draws close to 50 boats. We also have four sailors attending the Orange Bowl in Miami: Jake Mayol (Optimist); Max Mayol (Laser Radial); Cameron Wood (CFJ); and Danielle Ahir (CFJ). They will travel to Coral Reef Yacht Club to compete across three different classes against competitors from more than 20 states and 25 countries.

Our Junior Mariners program, designed for non-racers, is steadily growing, largely due to our incredibly generous instructor, Berkeley Green. He has provided his personal boats to us, at no cost, in order to give these kids opportunities to sail on multiple and different platforms. Junior Mariners get the chance to sail small dinghies, such as the RS Tera, Feva and Aero. Recently, we have been using the new RS Venture keel, which is a 16' fiberglass skiff/keel hybrid design with an asymmetrical spinnaker and trapeze. We are fortunate to have a coach like Berkeley leading this group, with the resources to make sailing fun for everyone. The BCYC Juniors are learning, competing and winning!

BCYC's 2016 racing schedule has something for everyone:

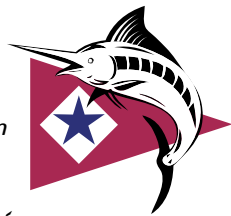
- MILLS SERIES – medium-distance races around oil islands and other marks

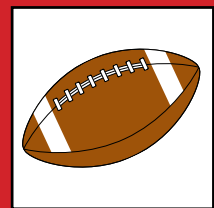
