## *Cruising to Howland's Landing*

With summer here and our agreement with LAYC in place, it is a great time to plan a trip to Howland's Landing. The LAYC mooring reservation system runs Friday through Thursday nights of each week from Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day. Our members should notify the BCYC club office **no later than noon** on Wednesday of their request for a mooring at Howland's Landing for the coming weekend. Reservations are available for up to seven days if you want to extend your stay.

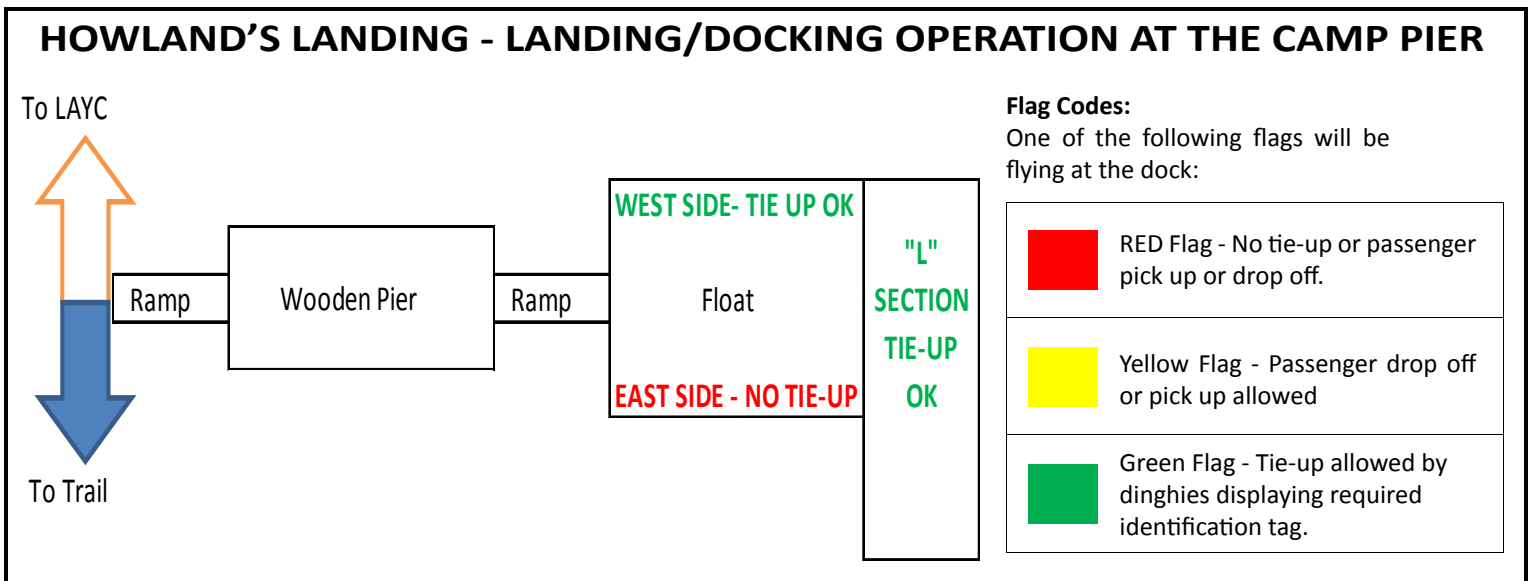
Confirmation will be provided to the BCYC staff and the member who has requested a reservation on Thursday afternoon. Confirmation will include the mooring number for each reservation. I expect there will be a learning curve for all involved, so please be patient as we get this process running smoothly. Moorage priority will be based on when reservations are received by our staff. Due to the various sized moorings, boat length overall (LOA) will also be a factor in availability of mooring assignments.

There is a fixed pier in the cove, managed by the youth camp. There are restrictions for its use. A colored flag system indicates whether the pier can be utilized for dinghy tie-up, if only pick-up or drop-off is allowed or if no tie-up or passenger pick-up/drop-off is permitted. Boaters can also land right on the beach if you are equipped to do so. There are too many rules for me to cover here, but they are available at the club office as well as on the club website under the cruising tab.

We have a list of governing rules for the cove that are similar to the other coves on Catalina Island. However, there are a few differences in place to ensure a quiet atmosphere. For example, onboard generator rules are more restrictive.

This year, Clambake will be held at Howland's. We are in the planning stages and I am looking forward to having the event on the lee side of the island. One challenge this year is the lack of fresh water on the island. Our friends at Del Rey Yacht Club informed us that NO water would be available if we held Clambake at their facility in Cat Harbor again this year.

One final thought — our visits to Howland's Landing provide us the opportunity to interact with other boaters from LAYC. Getting to know other boaters is one of the major benefits of being on the water. I hope to see many of you in the cove this summer and also, please plan to attend our upcoming club cruises this year. Many do not require you to have a boat to participate. I know if you attend, our Cruise Committee will ensure you have a great time!

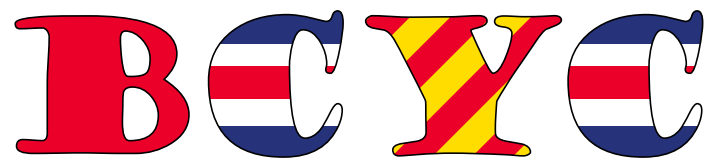
### Camp Corinthian Open For Registration!

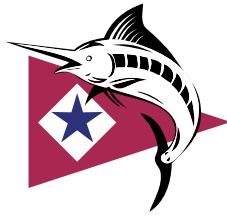

While no one knows for sure what fishing will be like in 2015, tuna are still being caught in good numbers off Cortes and Tanner Banks. These banks are approximately 100 miles offshore, sitting side by side, about 50 miles southwest of San Clemente Island. Yellowtail have been found all over, with the larger species caught closer to these two banks. With no true El Nino in 2014, this summer is when a real El Nino is supposed to start. This season could be a fisherman's dream!

Last year, a blue marlin was caught off the coast of Southern California, the first in 83 years. With the prediction of continued warmer waters than normal, there is a real possibility blue marlin will be caught in our area this year. There should be plenty of dorado and tuna, and we may even see some wahoo.

Speaking of wahoo, Roland Rapp caught a 32-pounder off Cabo San Lucas on the Pacific Ocean side. So far this year, on the fish leader board, is Roland's wahoo and the sail fish caught by Director Abbott Ayloush. Thanks, guys, for letting me know, as I will be keeping track of our members' catches. I got some clarification from Commodore Delaney – you can catch your fish anywhere in the world for it to count as part of the angling award at the end of the year. Once again, when you catch a fish, let me know, and provide a picture, as well as the weight of the fish for documentation.
