The 44th Annual Figawi Race, from Hyannis to Nantucket, Massachusetts, begins May 24. *Dock Lines  
Done Correctly*

Ahoy. It's hard to believe Opening Day is already here. Summer will surf in before you know it – are you ready? Is your boat ready? As you prepare for the summer boating season, please note your slip and surroundings. The marina is an important part of BCYC, and we appreciate your comments on the marina's condition and assisting us in keeping our docks ship-shape. Over the years, many yacht service providers and visiting boaters have expressed appreciation for the neat, clean docks at BCYC.

There is only one way to attach your dock line to a cleat, as shown in this picture. Also, please Flemish your extra line – it looks neat, allows the line to drain when wet, and stands ready for immediate use.



These pictures, taken in January, are a reminder to all regarding improper securing of dock lines. Lines in the condition shown are dangerous in any kind of weather since, when under pressure, they would have to be cut if there was a problem! In normal conditions it looks sloppy, and takes too long to unknot and be usable. Also, it shows disrespect for all of your neighbors in the marina. Inspect your dock lines and replace if frayed or worn. Thank you for your compliance and assistance for the safety of your vessel and the BCYC marina.

## Renovation Moving Forward

Excellent progress has been made on the lower-level renovation and elevator installation project: the patio concrete was poured just in time for access to the multipurpose room during Showboat; rough electrical, plumbing and air conditioning ducting have passed inspection; electrical wiring has been completed for the patio lighting; and drywall work is progressing, following the woodwork that started in late March.

As you read this edition of *The Masthead*, walls and ceilings are being painted. Tile work started during the second week of April, with the barbecue counter area to follow soon after. The elevator and elevator tower, plus cabinet installation on the second and third floors, are moving rapidly.

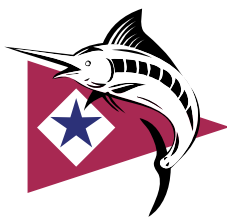
We are continuing with club improvements reflecting our need to become more energy efficient. Currently, we're evaluating replacing the existing parking lot lights with LED fixtures. As in the past, we see the need to have these lights on at night for the benefit of marina tenants who park overnight. Additionally, we have cleaning crews on site five nights a week.

Bids are in for replacing the remaining original windows and doors that had not been replaced in the past – they are being evaluated by the Board of Directors.

*Fishing Phenomenon*

Does your boat freak out the fish? Fish hear sounds and feel vibrations along their lateral line, the location of a series of special sensory organs called neuromasts that run along their flanks. Inside neuromasts are tiny hairs in a jelly-like medium – with those tiny hairs, a fish can sense movement and vibrations in the water. The distance their neuromasts sense is about as far as you can cast. If you drop a sinker on the deck or close a hatch with a bang, fish sense this and could leave the area. This is why commercial sword fishing boats have long bow sprits.

Engine noise is another factor in whether you catch fish, especially with two-stroke motors, since they make a lot of noise. A good remedy is it to turn the motor off and drift to your fishing spot. Oddly enough, some big diesel sport fishing boats create a sound with the swing of their large props that will bring fish to the boat. To certain types of game fish, the sound produced by large diesel engines emulates fish boiling on the surface. There are some boat manufacturers that brag about how good the harmonics are on their boat. There are even some gung-ho fishermen who will go so far as to paint their prop blades red, green and yellow because they think that will also attract fish.

Some species are attracted to certain electrical fields and are repelled by others. There are some fishing-tackle manufacturers that have capitalized on this phenomenon by building battery-powered marlin lures that when activated, will produce a sound that attract these fish – I have personal experience with this phenomenon.

You will still need to be in the right place at the right time! Good luck fishing.

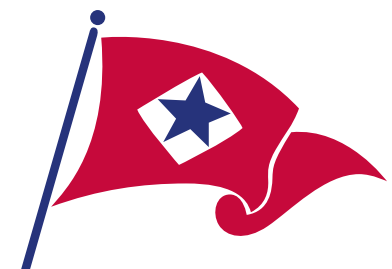

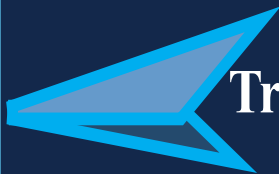
