2016 has been a fun year welcoming new members to the BCYC family and we are looking forward to 2017 as more people join our club.

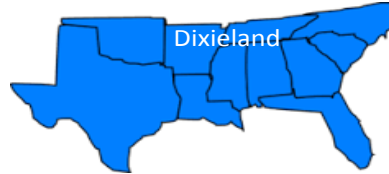

### *Awesome Results*

BCYC sailors successfully defended their title as Team High-Point Champions at the 11th Annual Corinthian Cup Regatta! Seventy-three junior sailors from eight different yacht clubs and sailing centers competed in this two-day event. In addition to the four Balboa Bay Fleet clubs (BCYC, BYC, LIYC, NHYC) kids from Long Beach, Alamitos Bay and Dana Point Yacht Clubs, and the Newport Sea Base participated. We also introduced the RS Tera class for the first time, making this one of the most diverse BCYC Junior regattas ever.

Despite light breeze on day one, each of the two venues ran five quality races before the end of the day. The weather made racing even more difficult on day two with pockets of rain and very bizarre wind conditions. The breeze managed a full 360 degrees of shifts over the course of an hour, hitting all the cardinal directions throughout the morning. Unfortunately, the breeze never settled and completely died in the early afternoon, forcing the Race Committee to call an early end to the regatta.

Thank you to Regatta Chairman Derek Johansson for helping put this event together, along with volunteers, including Kevin Jefferies, Tom Orradre, Amber Orradre and Ramsey Johansson, Junior Events Committee chair. Without all of this support, we would not have been able to run such an efficient regatta!

Matt has passionately implemented weekly workouts and unique drills, as well as encouraging Corinthian team spirit. The Sea Kings also now practice as a collective unit, bringing together BCYC sailors from prior separat-ed junior varsity and varsity teams, and new freshmen. This change has allowed new sailors and veterans to learn from each other.

CdM sailing's "Corinthianization" has already garnered some exciting results. BCYC sailors Max Mayol, Ryan Tolsma and Catherine Webb stood at the top of the podium at the high school Sea Otter Regatta. The CdM team followed up with a second at the Keelboat Qualifier due to the exploits of Max Mayol and Cameron Wood, and first at the Girls' Invitational with Catherine Webb again at the top! Lastly, BCYC and CdM sailors Alyssa Fries and Chris Sandoval captured a first place at Corinthian Cup, BCYC's recent club regatta.

Because of the shared sailors' and Coach Matt's guidance, there is no doubt that the BCYC program and Corona del Mar team will continue to fortify and propel each other throughout this year's sailing season.

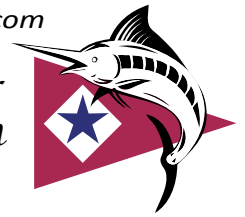

Saltwater  
Fishing in  
Mexico



In the November issue of *The Masthead*, I shared a freshwater fishing tale. Now we are going to take a journey to the ocean waters off Guadalupe Island, 195 nautical miles south of Ensenada, Mexico. This story will help show the diversity of fishing spots you can enjoy as an active angler. BCYC member Steve Brown recently had the opportunity to join a small group fishing in Mexican waters.

"I was happily included aboard an annual long-range fishing charter to Guadalupe Island, an island about the size of Catalina, aboard *The Apollo*. Fishing in this area is by permit only, an extensive process that saw no less than 12 officials visiting the boat and collecting the cash-only permit cost of \$200 per person.

"Upon arrival at the island, the captain used sonar to locate a school of yellow fin tuna. Using live sardines as bait, we started hooking up huge tuna weighing 80-100 pounds. Some took up to 90 minutes to gaff. This being my first long-range trip, I was a bit overwhelmed with the learning curve – tying knots for whoppers is challenging, including spectra, terminal, snell, cinch and the San Diego jam knot – they are now burned to memory. After a brief flurry of hooking and losing these Jurassic monsters, the crew calmly announced that sharks had arrived. Seeing a great white on television is not the same as seeing one up close. The first on the scene was about 19 feet and easily bit the hooked tuna, leaving only the head. This was a great trip, with a dedicated crew who pampered us, one of the best fishing experiences ever."



Whether in your dinghy on the backside of Catalina, in the eastern Sierras or off the coast of Mexico, fishing spots and types of fish caught vary greatly. Make time to enjoy being on the water and you might even catch dinner!

*Safety, Safety*

Ahoy. I hope everyone had a great boating season and have enjoyed BCYC.

The BCYC juniors had a fabulous year with their events and greatly appreciate everyone's assistance and enthusiasm. Power Fleet Captain Paul Secard has all coach boats in the best condition we've seen in a number of years and all but two have new motors. This makes maintenance a minor expense and boats safer for all users. Congratulations!

Thank you to all boat owners in the marina for keeping your boat and slip neat and safe. We are continually looking at ways to make our BCYC marina better. Thanks to Juver Garcia and Mario Nieto for maintaining the docks in such good condition – they do an amazing job on the docks and in the clubhouse.

Safety is always a priority. In case you have not noticed, there is an orange life ring with throw rope on each of the three dock ramps. These are for marina emergencies only. Please do not "borrow" or use for anything but an emergency.



There are 13 in-the-water boarding ladders, painted yellow, for anyone falling into the bay to easily get back on the dock. Every finger has two, with three on E dock. They are easily spotted on the docks by the yellow piling cap at each ladder. Know where they are on your dock: A dock-A2 and A7; B dock-B6 and B9; C dock-C6 and C9; D dock-D4 and D10; E dock-E4, E7, E10; F dock-F2 and F10.



As a reminder, PLEASE check in with Susie Broderick, waterfront manager, **anytime** you are bringing your vessel to the docks as a guest. Just because there is no vessel at the dock does not mean it is available, as we have many visiting guests and all space is reserved through Susie. It causes unnecessary problems when club members or guests with reciprocal privileges, who made a reservation, cannot dock because someone has docked without checking in first. This includes Monday and Tuesday when the club is typically closed. See you on the dock.

It is my honor and privilege to continue as Las Commodoras president in 2017. We have a fun and exciting year planned. We welcome you to be an important part of each event.



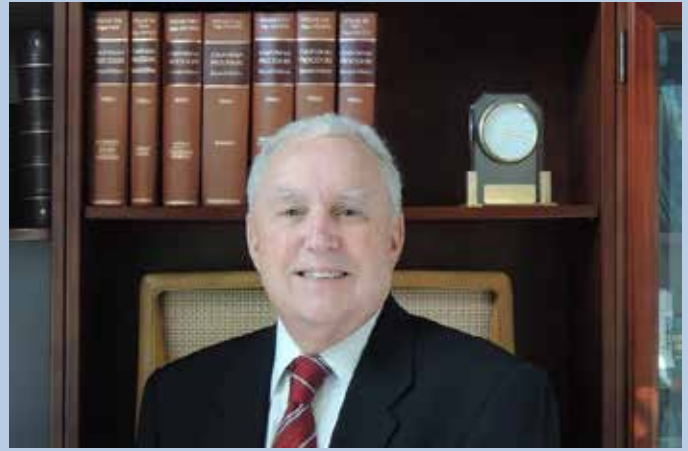

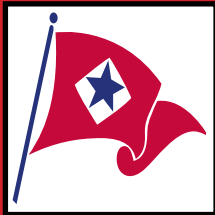
