We placed our order with Ullman Sails in late April and I am pleased to report that we have taken delivery of our

*Sea Lions - Oh My!*

Conversations in the Columbia Room run the gamut from fun tales of prowess at sea to serious discussions about boating. Recently, EB Barden brought up the topic of sea lions and our role in keeping our harbor safe, quiet and thriving during sea lion season. This generally runs from now through October, when sea lions seek large flat surfaces, such as vessels or docks upon which to rest. Often, they compete with each other by loudly barking day and night.

Per Newport Beach Municipal Code (NBMC) 17.25.020 and 17.50.100, it is your responsibility to proactively secure vessels, docks and appurtenances from sea lion intrusion. Failure to take sea lion deterrent action within seven days of notification may result in a citation. Newport Beach recommends that you call Harbor Resources (949-644-3041) or the Harbor Patrol (949-723-1002) with the location or mooring number of any vessel on which you observe sea lions aboard.

Primarily, sea lions seek out vessels or docks that have easy access or no deterrents. Pennants, snow fencing or noise-making devices will help protect your property from a sea lion invasion. Two companies cited by the City of Newport Beach to help with sea lion abatement are Seal Stop (949-607-7050) and South Mooring (949-645-0334). Visit [newportbeachca.gov/harborinfo](http://newportbeachca.gov/harborinfo) and click on Sea Lions for more information.

Now that we have taken care of that noisy and smelly problem, make plans to enjoy the summer BCYC-style. Participate in the scheduled cruises, BCYC/LLS dinner/auction/dance event, Winemaker dinner, Taco Tuesday buffet and racing, Movie Nights, the Fourth of July celebration and Clambake. Ahhhhhh, so much good stuff!

Director Stuart Leigh finished second in class and repeated his 2017 performance as BCYC's first to finish boat on corrected time in a cruising class. Commodore Chuck Wert achieved the best elapsed time for a cruising class boat. Overall race results are posted at the club. Other members racing their boats in this race or heading up race teams were: Len Bose, *Horizon* team manager; Steve Brown, *Dark Star*; Caleb Everett, *Tortuga*; Brian Mayhugh, *Dare*; Bill McNamara, *Radiant*; and Owen Provence, *Moonlight Lady*. Congratulations to everyone at BCYC who prepped boats and entered them as skippers, and the many more who raced as crew.

BCYC was also well-represented in N2E race management. Several other members headed to Ensenada, land-cruise style, to be part of the festivities. Special thanks to Director Silvia and Cary Breeden who hung BCYC banners prominently at Hotel Coral.

Weeks before N2E, Peter Haynes and Jim Kerrigan served in the pit crew for the Baldwin Cup, tuning the rigs on 26 boats and having them repaired and ready for teams to move from boat to boat here in Newport Harbor. In fact, many of the Baldwin Cup volunteers frequently race in BCYC's Harbor 20 events. Watch the 2018 race calendar and plan to enjoy an afternoon watching Baldwin Cup team racing next year. We're lucky to have it in our back yard.

Several BCYC members watched one of the great World Match Racing Tour events – the annual Congressional Cup – from the comfort of an anchored boat or a bar stool on the Belmont pier. Match racing is what we'll be watching later this year when the America's Cup challenger elimination races pit nearly identical 50-foot rigid wing sail catamaran boats against one another to determine who will face USA Team Oracle for the cup. 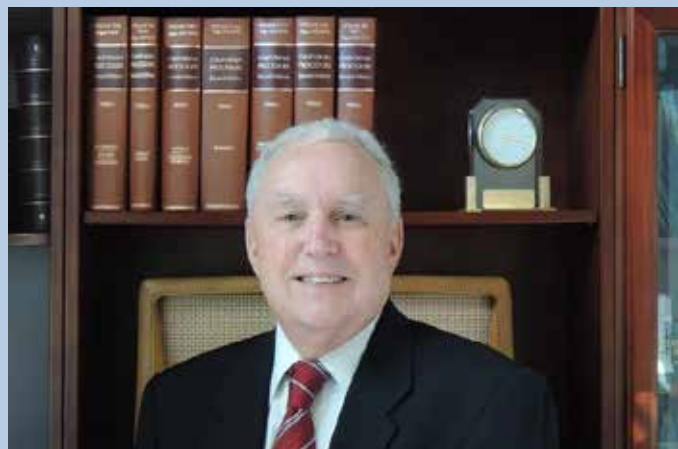
