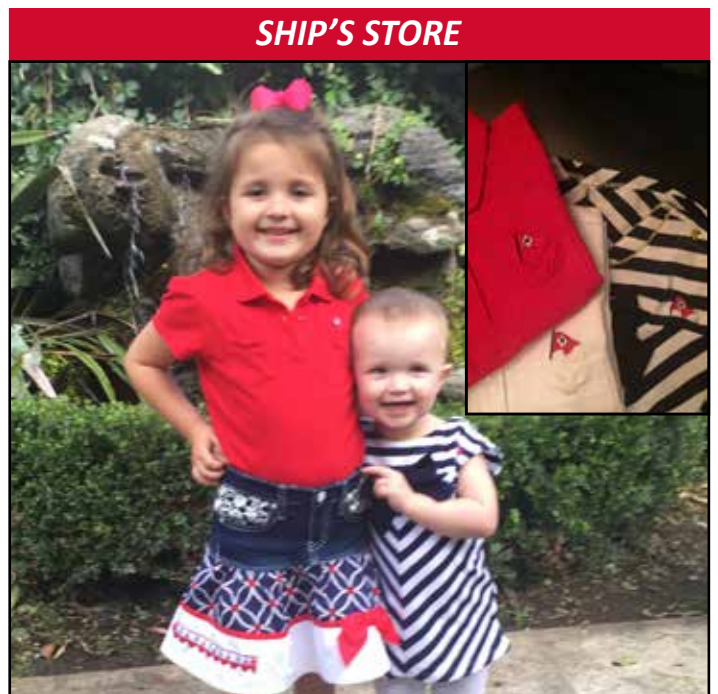
Back to the Future

*The Alphabet Soup of  
Corinthian Yachting*

What is Corinthian yachting and what do all these acronyms mean? Corinthian yachting relates to boating for pleasure, as opposed to boating for income or financial gain. Corinth, Greece was the birthplace of the Pan-Hellenic games and the term Corinthian sporting has come to imply achieving the highest ideals of amateur sportsmanship, fair play and volunteerism. So, someone yachting purely for pleasure (cruising, racing or just messing around in boats) is engaged in Corinthian yachting. Someone installing your new head holding tank, or trying to sell you a boat is not.

Internationally, Corinthian yacht racing is governed by World Sailing (formerly ISAF). Each country that participates in Olympic sailing (and many that don't) have national organizations to oversee Corinthian yachting. In the United States, we have the United States Sailing Association (USSA). Within USSA, there are Regional Sailing Associations regions (RSA) that assist USSA in assigning sail numbers to racing sailboats and in organizing the Corinthian yacht clubs (and their race calendars) in that region. BCYC belongs to the Southern California Yachting Association (SCYA) and the Yacht Racing Union of Southern California (YRUSC). These are both RSAs of USSA that cover roughly the same geography, but YRUSC membership is restricted to Corinthian yacht clubs numbering 31, with facilities to present major regattas and seminars. SCYA has 95 member organizations, including all the YRUSC clubs, yacht clubs with smaller facilities, Community Sailing Associations (CSA) and some virtual clubs that do not have their own facilities (called paper clubs).

Now, if a Corinthian sailor wanted to enter his/her sailboat in a USSA-sanctioned race in our area, he/she would have to belong to a Corinthian organization that belonged to an RSA. Also, the boat would need RSA-assigned sail numbers on its sails and a handicap rating from Performance Handicap Racing Fleet of Southern California (PHRF SOCAL).

That's a lot of acronyms, and we haven't even looked at the ones describing all the measurements PHRF requires before issuing a rating. Like many activities, yachting has a unique vocabulary and customs. The more we learn them, the more enjoyment we can derive from our shared love of Corinthian sailing and our friendly members who make up BCYC.

*New Dock  
 Installed!*

I'm pleased to report the expansion of the modular plastic dock below the crane has been nearly completed. As shown in this photo, we can now store five CFJs on permanent cradles down at the water's edge, dramatically decreasing the amount of time spent rigging and launching each day. This increases the time our juniors spend on the water sailing by up to an hour each day! I'd like to thank BCYC Head Coach Matt Peter for leading the assembly operation, along with several of our junior sailors who volunteered their time to help get the "legos" put together, including Michael Farris, Max Mayol and Cameron Wood.

Of course, we would not be here today without the tremendous support generated by The Gala last fall. Special thanks to Ramsey Johansson and Director Rhonda Tolar for their commitment in making that event so successful and for laying the groundwork for this fundraiser to continue into the future.

*A Shift in  
 Junior Sailing*

Responding constructively to shifts out on the water is a fundamental skill to succeed across all types of sailboat racing. Every well-trained sailor is able to notice and react to a shift – and at the moment a very interesting shift is rolling through junior sailing as a whole: boat class preference.

A few years ago, as I made my transition from sabot racing to CFJs, the CFJ itself was the most prevalent Southern California class for kids who had outgrown smaller dinghies. CFJ nationals attracted the top sailors each year, and the Shadden Series was a competitive mecca of fierce sailors determined to win and emerge with prestige. However, though the winners of both events still maintain respect as talented sailors, the popularity of CFJs had declined the past few years, making way for growing club 420 interest.

The C420 has always attracted east and west coast sailors to national events. However, the explosion in interest has recently skyrocketed. The 2015 C420 nationals attracted the most competitors it ever had, breaking the stereotype that this boat was only for a select group of intense sailors. Another more recent addition is the high performance 29er that is gaining greater popularity, as demonstrated by the addition of a separate girls' fleet at the ISAF Youth Worlds.

The shift in youth sailing to higher performance boats shows no bounds, as even a relatively new catamaran fleet, the Nacra 15, makes its debut in both California and as a new class to train in at the prestigious CISA clinic. Kids are hungry to compete in the fastest, newest and highest performance boats and it seems as though this trend will only continue in the years to come.

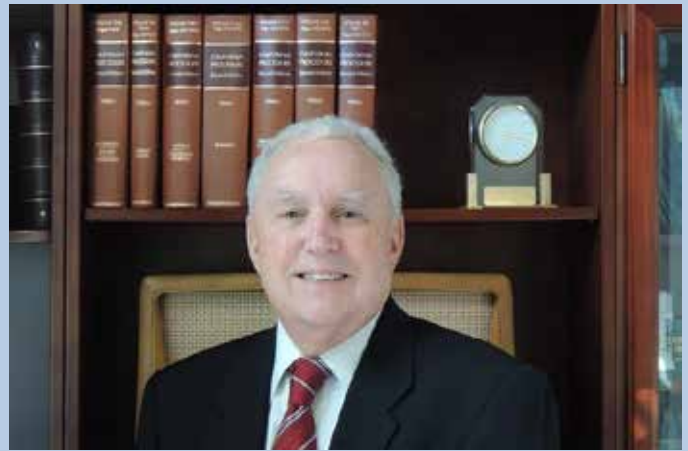
