The Corinthian Spirit

I often get asked what Corinthian spirit means in the context of the BCYC mission statement. My quest to provide a good answer to this question, thus began.

Located in Newport Beach, in Southern California, BCYC is situated in one of the most affluent parts of the United States. We are known as the “friendliest club on the bay” due to our all-embracing commitment to a Corinthian spirit.

I discovered that Corinth was one of the wealthiest cities in the ancient Greek world. Its prime location on the Isthmus of Corinth, in the middle of the Greek lands, surrounded by fertile plains and natural springs, and boasting two seaports, made it a prime destination for traders. Much the same as modern Newport Beach, which is located on the Santa Ana River delta in the Orange County plain, Corinth held much sway in the region.

Corinth was vested in the sea and is also known as the birthplace of the Trireme, the warship that became standard issue for Mediterranean powers for generations. Corinth

and Corcyra fought the first naval battle ever recorded, in 665 BC, and Corinth won. Similarly, great names such as Viking, Shock, Duffy, McGregor, et al., embellish Newport’s history.

Corinth was also highly competitive and sports-oriented, and the Isthmian Games took place the year before and the year after the Olympic Games. Beginning in the sixth century B.C., male participants competed in boxing, chariot racing, pankration and wrestling. Music and poetry contests were open to all. (Showboat had a place too!)

In the late 19th century, the Corinthian Club was formed in England to counter the emergence and rise of professionalism in sport. The Corinthian spirit was seen as a means to counteract the decline of amateurism in sport. This spirit of fair play was embodied in the famous principle that if a penalty was awarded against the team, the goalkeeper must vacate the goal to allow the opposition to score and take its just rewards for the violation of the rules (and the spirit) of the game. Based on my research, it was becoming clear to me that BCYC and her members truly do embrace all of the elements of the Corinthian spirit.

At BCYC, the Corinthian spirit carries with it an influential embrace of the Newport Beach community at large, our historical place for more than 61 years, our growing BCYC membership in particular, and a full commitment to hospitality, friendly fair-play and uncompromising sportsmanship. This Corinthian spirit makes BCYC a true gem in Newport Beach.
