For those of you who raced in the SCYA Midwinter Regatta, you might have noticed that Race Committee had no trouble determining wind direction and wind speed. Just look at the orange flag. It's straight out with 18-20 knots from the northwest. So, what are we doing? We're deciding where to anchor the pin. The mark set boat is in the background, heading to where we are pointing in this picture below.

For Taco Tuesdays, we will have two start/finish lines, one for Harbor 20s and one for PHRF boats. Make sure you start – and finish – on the correct line. From May 14 through the end of August, it's evening racing at its best. Have you lined up your crew? Have you found a boat to sail on? Use the Crew Forum on the BCYC Racing website!

We will be wrapping up the Lorin Weiss Series this month, just in time for the Harbor 20s to switch into evening racing mode.

The first installment of the Leukemia Cup Regatta will run June 2. Harbor 20s will switch back to weekend sailing and sail multiple windward/leeward races, alongside the Juniors who will be sailing in other parts of the harbor. A truly big day for racing and fund-raising.

 Sailing Program*

I could not be more excited to be your new Junior Sailing Director at BCYC. It's my objective to carry on the high standard cultivated by my predecessors, while adding new ideas in order to raise the bar at BCYC even higher.

Moreover, our Junior Sailing Program has been extremely busy and I have a lot of exciting news to share with you.

Since coming aboard last September, re-imagining our double-handed program (C420 and CFJ) has been one of my primary goals. I'm glad to report that I had the privilege of coaching new BCYC junior member Reade Decker en route to capturing the 2019 CFJ Shadden Series Championship Trophy — previous winners include a laundry list of College All-Americans.

Additionally, our Club 420 program has taken several strides forward in recent months, garnering participation from sailors affiliated with all four of the major yacht clubs in Newport Harbor — and a podium finish (3rd) at the last Perry Series event at San Diego Yacht Club by Jeffrey Petersen/Marbella Marlo. BCYC members Gretchen Hoenstein and Tyler Wood also sailed well in this event. In February, we sent a team to the Mid-Winters in Jensen Beach, Florida. This summer, BCYC will be combining efforts with Lido Isle Yacht Club to create the largest 420 racing team in Newport Harbor with an 11-boat fleet. This team will offer our junior sailors the opportunity to compete at both regional and national events — traveling to San Francisco for the North Americans and the east coast for Buzzards Bay Regatta and potentially more!

On the single-handed side of things, it's important to note that we've had tremendous energy at Friday Spring Practices, as well as attracting new faces looking for Mark Gaudio's Naples Sabot expertise. Mark has been coaching our racers, getting them ready for the robust summer regatta circuit on Balboa Bay, while our C3 and novice coaches continue to help younger sailors develop their skills and prepare for the big time.

BCYC has also enjoyed some new single-handed energy in the form of the O'pen BIC, championed by Joel Stone, who successfully put on a BIC demo day at the club in February. I think his efforts to introduce the O'pen BIC should be applauded, as well as the participation of his kids, Isaac and Katherine, in the O'pen BIC North American Championships at Mission Bay Yacht Club.

Last but not least, the 2019 Camp Corinthian Summer Program Registration is open and filling up fast! Please do

not wait to sign up your sailors. Available to both members and non-members (so please tell your friends!), Camp Corinthian's program will be bolstered by a phenomenal coaching staff, including local Newport Beach talent as well as coaches from the east coast (**and, we are still looking for volunteers to house them, so please let me know if you can help out**). Whether your sailor is a 420 racer looking to travel the country seeking out the best competition, or a youngster brand new to the sport looking to join our Starfish group, we have a class for you!
