Board of Director Elections

In November, BCYC Flag Members will elect members to fill six vacancies on our board of directors. It's important you take time to understand our board of directors' election process. The following is a brief summary of this process, but please refer to our BCYC bylaws for a complete explanation.

The board election process begins with the formation of a seven-person Nominating Committee. This year's Nominating Committee includes the following individuals (as specified by section 8.8 of our bylaws):

- Junior Staff Commodore as chairperson (Jerry Shandera)
- Two Staff Commodores (Paul Konapelsky and Tom Madden)
- Two Junior Directors (Cary Breeden and Rhonda Tolar)
- Two Flag Members elected by the Board of Directors (Larry Fortmuller and Ramsey Johansson)
- Current Commodore (Steve Moffett): shall be an ex officio member, voting only to break a tie

As part of the Nominating Committee's process, current Vice Commodore, Ginny Lombardi, and Rear Commodore, Rhonda Tolar, will make their recommendations for candidates for the Board of Directors. The committee will consider these recommendations along with recommendations by each member of the Nominating Committee. After thorough discussion and review, the Nominating Committee will nominate six candidates (the number of vacancies this year). These candidates' names must be delivered to Secretary Kari Konapelsky no later than Sept. 29.

Secretary Konapelsky will then post this list of candidates on the bulletin board in the clubhouse and direct the list be mailed to each Flag Member by Oct. 12. Flag Members may make additional nominations by petition, signed by at least 20 voting members and presented to Secretary Konapelsky by Oct. 26. These additional nominations will also be posted on the bulletin board.

The next step in our board election process is the formation of the Elections Committee. As specified in section 8.9 of our bylaws, this committee will be made up of Junior Staff Commodore Jerry Shandera and four Flag Members appointed by the commodore (none of these members may be officers, directors of BCYC or candidates for election as director).

The chairperson of the Elections Committee will have ballots mailed to each voting Flag Member by Nov. 6. These ballots will include each candidate nominated by the Nominating Committee and any additional candidates properly nominated by Flag Members, as specified above.

Flag Members then have until Nov. 15 to vote for six (our number of vacancies this year) candidates and deliver their properly completed ballots by mail on or before Nov. 16. The ballots, when received, shall be placed in a locked box by the club staff.

By Nov. 19, the Elections Committee will review and verify each ballot as properly cast, count the votes cast for each candidate and certify the results of the election to Commodore Steve Moffett. The six candidates receiving the most votes will be named to our six open board seats this year. The Elections Committee chairperson shall then give notice by mail of the results of the election to the members of BCYC.
