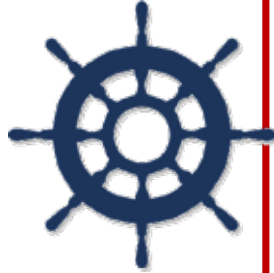

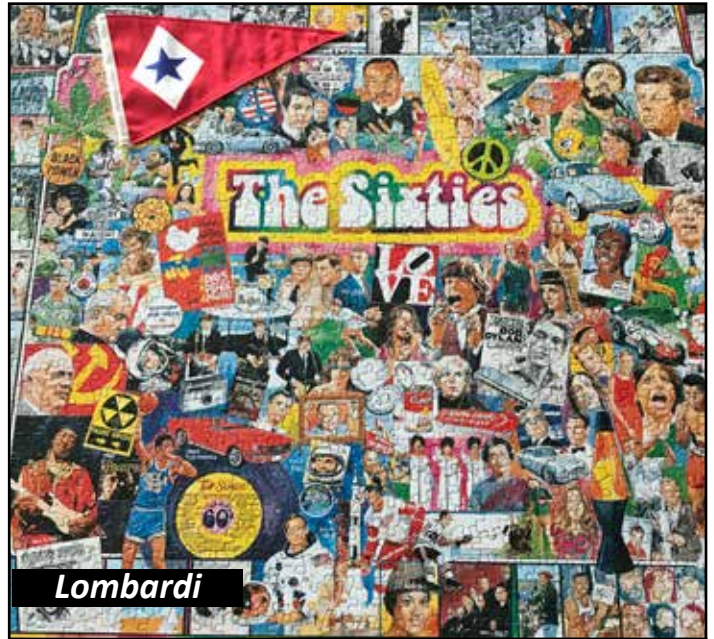

In the Junior Sailing department, we are saddened by the widespread suspension of local and national sailing practices and regattas. Over the past 18 months, Junior Sailing at BCYC has flourished and our sailors and coaches were on a roll heading into March. At this time, BCYC Junior Sailing's Spring Program, private and semi-private lessons, and regattas are all suspended until further notice. The club is still open to junior members who wish to go sailing, but social distancing guidelines **must** be followed. Given the pandemic's unknown path of evolution and the lack of understanding as to its near-term impact on the sport of sailing, and the consequences with regards to the differing measures of confinement taken by federal, state and local governments, we cannot guarantee exactly when the Spring Program will take place. Our current plan is to run a condensed version mid-to-late May and early June to get our sailors ready for the summer! I am monitoring the situation closely with the goal of getting us back out on the water as soon as it is safe. We are currently operating under the belief that the measures being taken to stop the spread of the virus will get us back to our normal way of life by summer and our traditional six-week Balboa Bay Summer Program will take place as usual June 22-July 3. Registration is open and accessible through the junior section of BCYC website.

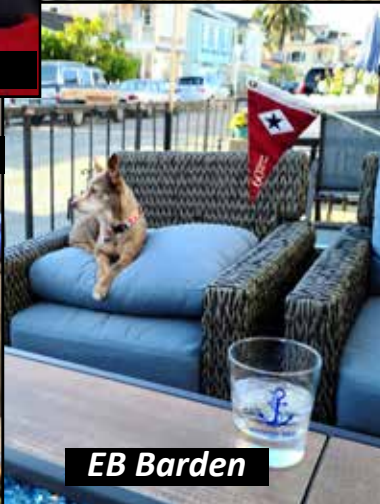

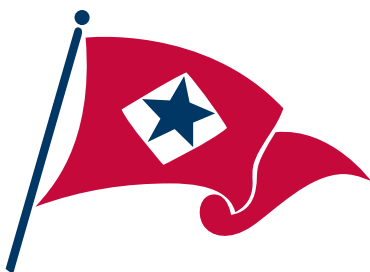
