Retiring the Colors

BCYC celebrates the time-honored naval tradition of retiring the colors, lowering the American flag at sunset. A BCYC commodore or director will ring the bell in the Columbia Room, signaling the start of this ceremony. All those on club property in sight of the flag should stand, salute or place their right hand over their heart until the flag is fully lowered. The American song, "Retreat," is played as the flag is lowered. This tradition began with the British Royal Navy and continues with the British and United States Navies. The ceremony celebrates respect for the American flag. Retiring the colors takes place at many yacht clubs, as well as United States military bases around the world. This event is how BCYC honors our country and displays our Corinthian spirit.

Our pool party on Saturday was a major “blow out” due to the winds, so we all decided to spend time in the hospitality room instead, having fun hanging out together.

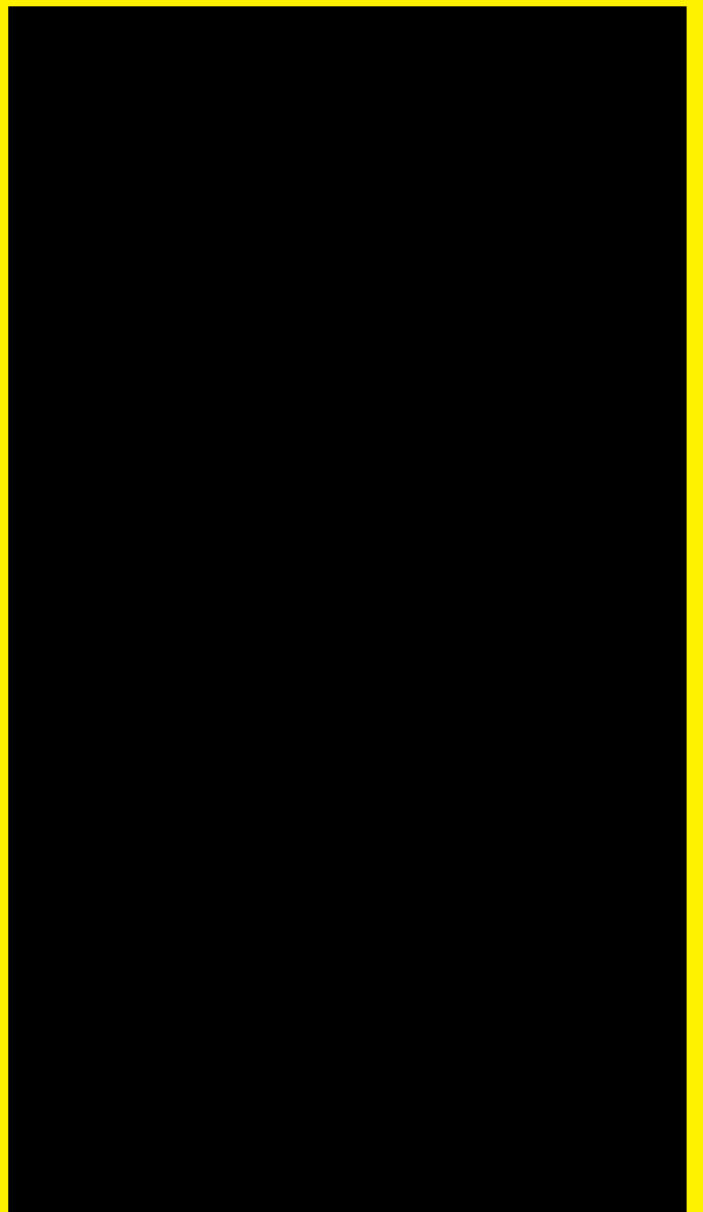

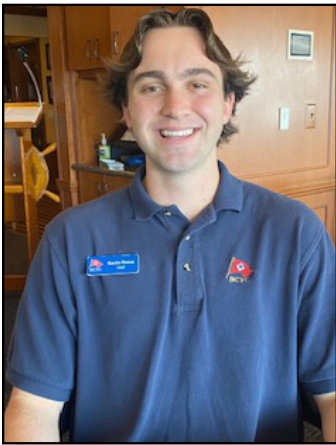

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DID YOU KNOW? Important Stuff

Did you know that if you need to cancel your reservation for a club event, you must cancel three or more "club days" before the event, when the club is open? This will allow you to avoid receiving a cancellation charge.

Did you know that even if you are going to just pick up passengers on our docks, you need to call ahead and reserve a spot? Any watercraft coming to the marina needs to have a burgee from BCYC or reciprocal club.

Did you know that our staff schedule is done based on event and dining reservations, and history for certain events? To assist with this process, and provide the best level of service, it is most helpful for members to make a reservation at least one day in advance. We can't always accommodate same day reservations.

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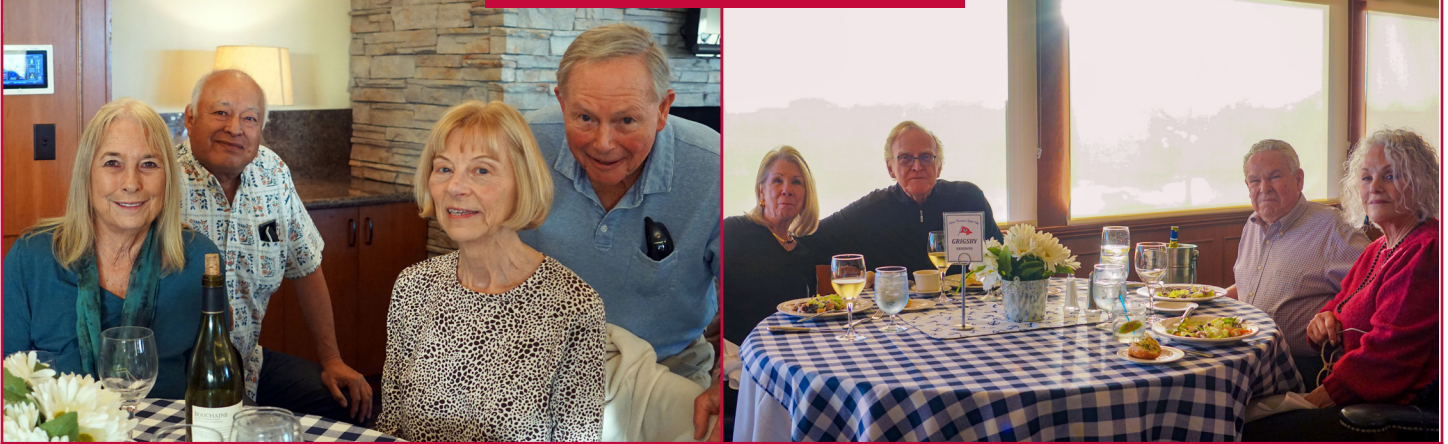

Calico, Rockfish, Bonita, Oh My!

Don't get left at the dock! Check out the club tournament site by clicking the BCYC angling tournament logo or scanning the QR code, and joining us. Members and guests are already on the leader boards. Sign up and add your photos to the site.

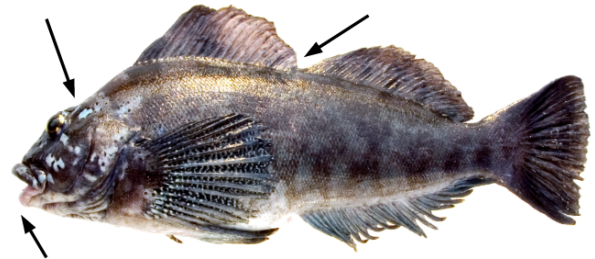
