- BCYC was the first West Coast yacht club to create an America's Cup contender when Pat Dougan and Walter Podolak entered *Columbia* in the 1964 trials
- *Columbia's* crew consisted of BCYC members

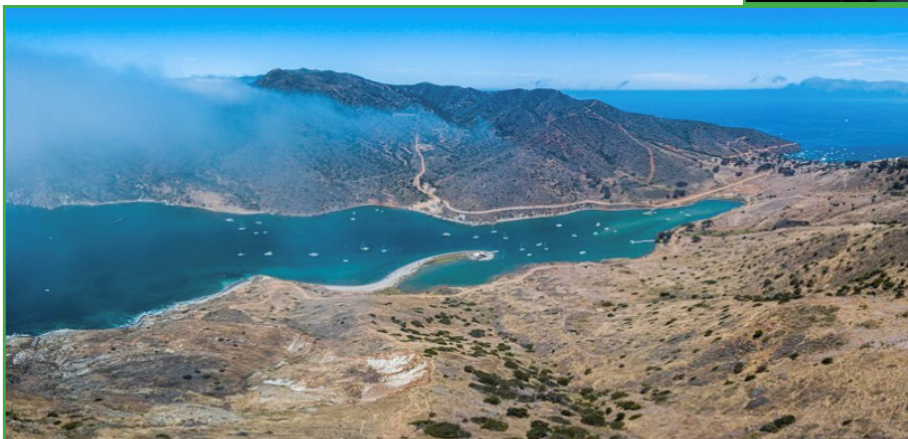
2022 Cruiseapooza Tour

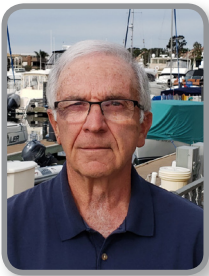

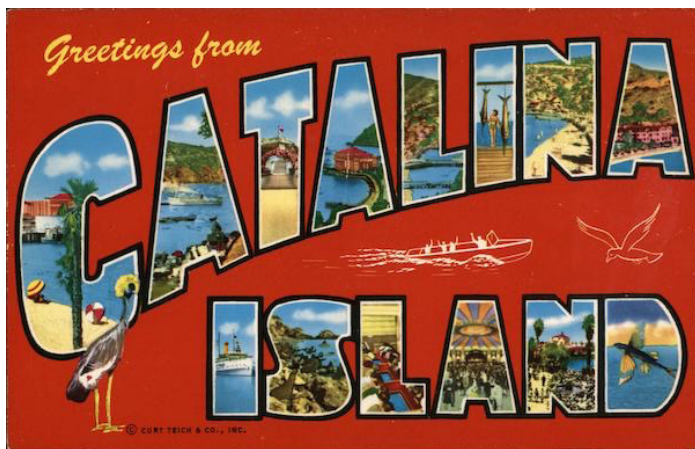

*26 Miles
Across the Sea...*

Do you watch Jeopardy? For a true Daily Double...the answer is, “The group that sang ‘26 Miles Across the Sea’ ...and the question is, “Who are the Four Preps?”

In March, we will again host one of the longest-running races in Southern California, the Humphrey Bogart Series. What makes this race so different from all of the others we host? First, it’s not a race, but a two-day weekend event with a race to Avalon on March 19, and a race back to Newport Beach on March 20 – a combined distance of almost 50 miles.



For those who have watched the start of the Saturday race, you’ll notice the boats head “up the coast” instead of straight toward Avalon. That’s because the wind is better farther north and sailing the extra distance actually improves your boat’s speed as you cross the channel to Catalina. So much for “a straight line is the shortest distance between two points” (only applies to power boats).

If you noticed the post on the BCYC Racing Facebook for the Bogart, you saw the words “motoring is allowed.” What? Aren’t motoring and sailing direct opposites? Well, technically yes, but the ability to use a motor really helps some of the “cruising” boats, those that are not optimized for racing, to get to the post-race party on time. We use the same scoring formula as NOSA does for the Newport to Ensenada Race. So cruisers, sign up for this race and join us in Avalon.

Cruising boats should also enter the remaining Angelman Series races. The Angelman races start and finish in the vicinity of Newport Pier and are usually about three hours

in duration. Courses involve going around one of the oil islands off Huntington Beach and/or one or two other marks. If enough cruising boats enter the series, we can establish a separate class for you. Talk to your friends.

The Lorin Weiss Series begins in March as well. BCYC members can charter the club’s Harbor 20 and sail in the harbor. Ask Waterfront Manager Debbie Dunne about it. We run five races per day, so there’s plenty of opportunity to excel...or to just have some fun. Members with junior racers should really take advantage of this and bring them as crew, or maybe you will be crew and they will steer!

Circling back to the beginning and the reference to the Four Preps, consider the following four steps to prep yourself for racing in 2022:

1. **CREW** – find and train a crew to help you sail around the racecourse. You can go to the [Skipper/Crew Forum](#) on the BCYC Racing website to advertise your need or contact me directly.
2. **PRACTICE** – as the adage goes, practice makes perfect. Practice also builds confidence in the crew’s ability to function as one and to have fun doing it. Race Committee can run some practice starts for you – just ask.
3. **BOAT** – use your own boat, regardless of its condition. The rating and scoring system provide an allowance for a boat that isn’t optimized for racing. One of our Distinguished Racing Members can help you get your boat in shape. Or, as noted earlier, you can charter the club’s Harbor 20.
4. **RACE COMMITTEE** – As usual, I end my articles with an offer to come aboard the Race Committee boat to learn how the race is conducted. You can watch how boats start and how they sail the course. Do a tour of duty on Race Committee and earn extra points!

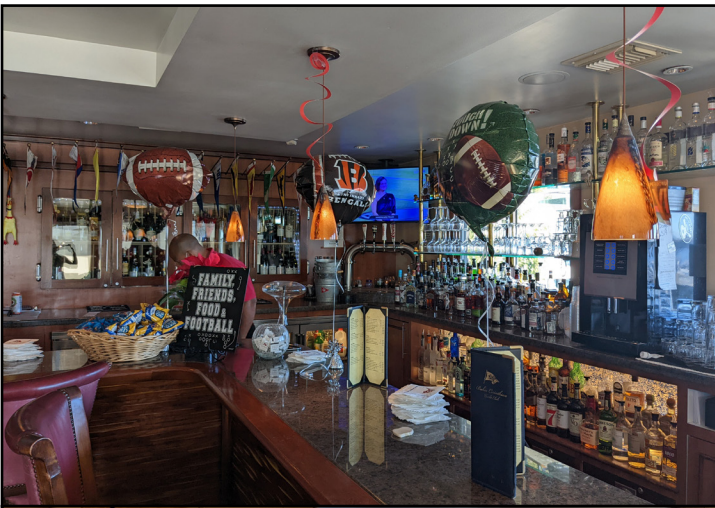

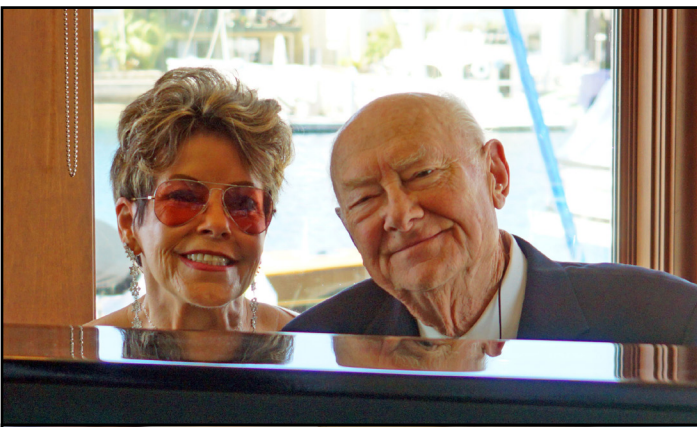
